

New Bethlehem Dam Pens



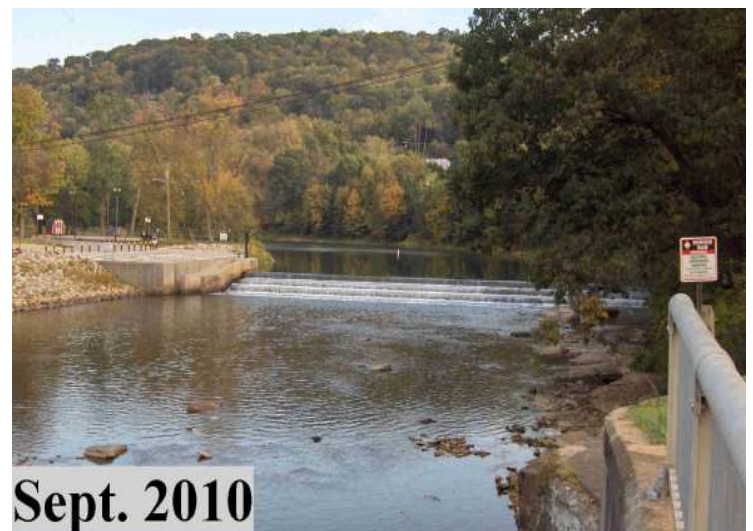
These pens are individually hand-made by Rich Horner of Horners Pens & Things from a 73 and a 183 year old tree used to build the original New Bethlehem dam. Some of the logs that formed the original dam were removed in 2009, as shown above, when the water intake system for the Redbank Valley Municipal Authority was improved, the race wall and piers removed and fish ladders and a stepped dam structure were installed to reduce the undertow. The trees used in the 1883 dam were believed to have been taken from near the dam and would have started growing in the area in about 1700 and 1810. The pens make beautiful gifts for those interested in a unique piece of New Bethlehem history.

The pens are being sold for \$32.00 each as a fundraiser for Redbank Renaissance and come with a certificate of authenticity, information describing the history of the pens and the dam and a collector's box. Only a limited number will be made. Rich Horner also offers other limited edition pens from the logs of the dam with engraving and pens, key chains and other items made from acrylics and other wood.
